

Hiring Sign Language Interpreter

About the Lab:

The NL3 Wang Lab is led by Dr. Wang, the NL3 team uses advanced brain imaging techniques to focus on early learning and brain development. The goal is to identify brain-behavior relationship and reveal how brain mechanism affects behavior, which can revolutionize our understanding of early development of certain cognitive process — language, literacy, learning — and shape evidence-based interventions and educational policies to enhance children's lives. Job Description:

The Interpreter provides interpreting services for deaf and hard-of-hearing research participants. During research visits, the Interpreter facilitates communication through use of sign language, spoken English, and cultural mediation. The Interpreter helps researchers to explain the instructions of research experiment.

Desired Skill Set and Experience:

- Experience in all age settings (children and adults)
- Strong interpersonal skills
- Can both receptively and expressively, interpret accurately, effectively, and impartially, using any necessary specialized vocabulary in order to convey research participants' messages accurately.

\$12-14/per hour based on the experience. The hourly rate can be negotiated based on experience.
